Apart from learning new things, by attending a workshop professionals can also build new relationships, establish connections with likeminded people, and even get to know clients and vendors on a more personal level. Benefits of a training program: Short-term Training – training includes any class or program that lasts less than two years. Many training programs are from 6-9 months. Generally all are less than two years. Free to Low Cost – Student may be able to access many free or low-cost training options online or in local communities. Options range from brushing up on basic skills (communication skills, workplace ethics) to mastering specialized 		matrix
