

Autism Services: Pre-ETS Students

Pre-Employment Autism Support (PEAS)

The Pre-Employment Autism Support (PEAS) program provides instruction in self-advocacy and social skills training to Pre-Employment Transition Services (Pre-ETS) students with Autism. Students participate in activities that help develop the soft skills needed to get and keep a job.

Counseling on Post-Secondary Education Opportunities (CPSEO)

In the Counseling on Post-Secondary Education Opportunities (CPSEO) program, PreETS students with Autism participate in activities that introduce them to the education, training and employment options available to them after high school, like apprenticeships, career training, job placement, and college. As part of this program, students will participate in a college tour.

Pre-ETS PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS:

Pre-Employment Transition Services (PreETS) are a set of services available to current students with disabilities to help them prepare for their future beyond school.

A student with a disability is defined as someone who:

- Is currently enrolled in high school (which includes home school or another alternative secondary education program), a post-high school education program such as college, or another recognized educational program like a trade school.
- Is at least 14 years old but less than 22.
- Has an Individualized Education Program (IEP), 504 plan, or medical records that document their disability.

To participate in WTC Autism Services programs for Pre-ETS students, the student should have a diagnosis of an Autism Spectrum Disorder.
