TRAINING INCLUDES

- 14 weeks of classroom instruction
- 6 weeks of clinical on-the-job training
- Training in CVS programs and procedures, inventory management, prescription medication measurements

Pharmacy Technicians assist pharmacists in hospitals or retail pharmacies, serving customers, processing insurance claims, maintaining inventory and filling prescriptions.

ABILITY TO:

- Pass a drug screen & background check prior to the start of the program
- Work accurately & quickly
- Lift up to 30 pounds
- Bend, stoop & stand for long periods of time
- Provide excellent customer service

BE:

- At least 18 years of age
- Detail-oriented

HAVE:

- HS Diploma or GED®
- Close visual acuity
- COVID-19 vaccination
- Computer, telephone and study skills
- Desire to work in a retail environment
- 9th-grade reading comprehension & math skills
