LAUREN: These services are individualized to your career goal and specific needs.

LAUREN (V.O.): DORS Student Employment Services may include:

VISUAL: Close up on the left column of the dors.maryland.gov home page. "Information About DORS in" becomes circled.

LAUREN (V.O.): Click on "Information About DORS in..."

VISUAL: Screen shot of the "Recepción a DORS" Spanish-language page of the DORS website.

LAUREN (V.O.): ...and select the student's or family's language.

VISUAL: Map of Maryland with pins in the DORS locations. The logos of DORS and the Maryland State Department of Education appear.

LAUREN (V.O.): MSDE DORS is located in more than 20 offices around Maryland.
